St. Clether of Cornwall

The little that is known about St. Clether is mainly based on pious tradition. He is believed to have been a descendant of King St. Brychan of Brycheiniog and is said to have been a disciple of St. Brynach. St. Clether left his native Wales for Cornwall where several churches and the civil parish of St. Cleer commemorate him. St. Clether is thought to have reposed in about 520. He is commemorated as St. Clether, hermit of Cornwall.
