St. Mawes, Bishop of Cornwall

(6th Century). St. Mawes is believed to have been a Welsh monk who, after a time in Cornwall living as a hermit and founding churches, moved to Brittany, living again as a hermit near Madez. It was said that he was consecrated in Brittany, and that he may have been associated with the Dol area. His cult in Brittany was always stronger than in Cornwall. His relics were claimed by Bourges.
